STWNA Community Survey Results

At the 11/06/06 STWNA meeting, a community survey was collected. We asked our community to rank from 1 to 5 the below listed five topics of interest (1 being of the greatest interest, 5 being of the least interest).

We assigned a point system to each ranking (#1 priorities got 5 points, #2 priorities got 4 points, #3 priorities got 3 points, #4 priorities got 2 points, and #5 priorities got 1 point) in an effort to gain understanding of what areas of interest our community deems important.

Below are the results. Note: this is not an absolute science but rather intended to be another means of gauging community interest.
