Most notably in his time there, Mark developed effective intervention programs for special education and English language learners. He started his career as an attorney with the city of San Francisco and was the general counsel for the San Francisco Unified School District for nine years. While there he gained a great understanding of public schools, as well as a passion for student achievement.

Switching gears to follow his passion, Mark got his teaching credential and became an elementary teacher, teaching third, fourth, and fifth grades before becoming a principal. Mark's focus is strongly centered on students. He has proven to be a collaborative leader, active and visible in his communities he's served, and possessing strong interpersonal skills and a sense of humor.

James P. Reber has been a leader in the Bay Area's nonprofit community for three decades. He is currently the Founding Executive Director of San Jose Parks Foundation, now in its third year of operations. He has organized the launch of the foundation and guided it with the support of community board of trustees and seed funding from the City of San Jose.

Mr. Reber was raised in Santa Clara County and is a graduate of Cupertino High School, served four years in the U.S. Navy and received a BA in Sociology from UC Berkeley. In 2000 James Reber was listed by the San Jose Mercury News as one of "The Silicon Valley 100", a compendium of persons from the 20th century who made significant contributions to life in Silicon Valley. He is a well-regarded public speaker, having given hundreds of speeches to a wide variety of local groups. His workshops on "How to produce A Signature Event" are especially popular with local nonprofits organizations.
