General Meeting 9/10/09 6:30 – 8:30 pm

### **Welcome & Introductions**

CO-President Peter Rushbrook welcomed everyone and asked the audience to take a moment to say hello to someone in the room they haven't met.

### **Police Department Representatives**

Campbell PD – Captain Adams

Captain Adams asked if everyone is enjoying the new signal light at Phoenix & Hamilton. PD has been focusing on areas near schools for traffic control. They made 101 traffic stops on Hamilton Ave, between Llewelyn and San Tomas Aquino and there have been 13 collisions.

DUI is up 54%, 8 in our area.

51 noise disturbance complaints

6 missing/runaway kids – all were found

56 property crimes, 18 were auto burglaries

A resident on Lisa Way had a boat stolen from his property. The wires had been cut to the nearby street light also.

Capt Adams recommended if residents see something doesn't look right, street lights out, etc. they should call PD.

It is becoming common now for thieves to cut and steal wire to recycle the copper inside for cash.

Recently, SJPD did a sting on recycling groups.

There were 2 reports of shots fired on Boise and on Superior....probably illegal fireworks.

In the Darryl area, some kids were approached and robbed by a suspect who pulled a knife.

3 weeks ago, a GPS was stolen from a vehicle. Another resident called in suspicious activity and the suspect was found.

Lil Ottos bar was closed by PD and Alcoholic Beverage Control – owners were charged several ABC violations. In addition there were drug sales and prostitution on the premises.

Capt reminded everyone not to leave valuables in view in a vehicle.

San Jose PD – Officer Foster

Things have been relatively quiet in our area this summer. Most crimes are near Cadillac Dr or near Starbird Park. Traffic study on 4 way stop on Darryl. There was a DUI suspect on darryl that hit parked cars. Residents followed and found suspect.

Buddhist Temple had wires cut also.

During summer kids were seen on Payne school property. Some teens loitering at Quik Stop, trying to get alcohol.

Question/comment – resident has seen teens walking across Westgate parking lot, near Hometown Buffet, seemed to be checking for unlocked cars

Question/comment – Moreland Way – car window was smashed, bookbag was stolen, including wallet.

Question/comment – whatever happened with gang shootings a few years ago? Arrests were made in the Cadillac Dr area

Question/comment – not as much gang graffiti lately. SJPD gang task force has been around a lot. Some gang members have moved out of the area.

Question/comment – is there a lot of gang activity in the Eden area? SJPD arrested some gang members attending a meeting in Hamann Park

Question/comment – Seems like the “parking police” have been active on Carola Ave & Court. Pete Constant commented there is a new pro-active parking unit.

### **Guest Speaker: Pete Constant**

#### **San Jose City Council Member, District 1 Representative**

Just returning to work since spinal surgery a few weeks ago. He has lived here 32 years. Grew up in the Strawberry Park area. Currently lives in the Saratoga & Williams area. Has 5 kids ranging 3-8 yrs old.

Former SJPD officer, 14 years.

City of San Jose has had a budget deficit for several years, \$400 million cumulative.

Less employees = less services. The first few years budget cuts were “trimming fat”, improving processes and technology. This year closed with a \$85 million deficit. State will take additional \$20 million. Next year’s projecting \$100 million.

City Council members don’t agree on priority of spending or cuts. Will try in October to have Council budget session to prioritize.

San Jose has 2800 miles of streets to maintain and is considered the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst roadway infrastructure in the US. Estimate is \$850 million to repair. Past budget cuts included deferring infrastructure maintenance.

Other major costs to the city are the pension system for city employees (\$3 billion), and healthcare for retirees (\$1.65 billion).

Residents need to hold elected officials accountable and are encouraged to get involved in budget issues.

People should shop in their city to help support w/ tax dollars.

Parking is the only department that makes a profit. There is a special “school zone” unit, focusing on red zones, bus zones.

Question/comment – What about plastic shopping bag issue? City’s proposal is to prohibit plastic and charge a fee (tax) for paper. – Pete disagrees with City’s plan, feels now is not a good time to start this. Is paper bag charge a fee or a tax? Should be voted on. Issue will be discussed at City Council mtg on 9/22. Pete discussed the Public Service employee’s pay scale and its impact to the budget. Many public employees were hired 20-30 years ago. Negotiations with unions are difficult to control. Two-thirds of the budget is public employees healthcare and retirement.

Question/comment – Hotels planning/development. Years ago city planners thought hotels, shopping, etc should be in city center. Now changing retail planning ideas. Example is Santana Row, more profitable in West San Jose than it would have been downtown.

City gets revenue from sales tax, property tax, building fees/charges. All 3 have decreased at the same time recently.

Question/comment – What about population growth and planning? We are the most stable district because most land is built out already. General plan will look at growth in relation to transportation, services, water, etc. Meetings are open to the public and info is available online.

Question/comment – Coyote development? On hold indefinitely.

Question/comment – City moneys coming in versus going out? By law they must balance budget somehow. Projecting 4 years till balanced budget without making cuts.

Question/comment – How many police officers retiring vs. new hires? Trying to anticipate vacancies, to allow for 18 month training period. San Jose has 1.4 officers per 1000 residents, while the average is 2.6 officers per 1000. In spite of that, city has highest homicide solving rate in state.

Pete introduced Megan , liaison for Neighborhood Association.
